## How to Enjoy Hokkaido

How to enjoy Hokkaido on the cheap! Tips for visitors from abroad!



For a relaxing—and perhaps romantic—day trip, I recommend visiting Iwamizawa Kouen Bara-en (Iwamizawa Park Rose Garden). The rose garden is only one part of the park, which also contains Hokkaido Greenland amusement park, a campground, and other facilities. This rose garden is the largest in Hokkaido, with over 8800 bara (rose bushes) and hamanasu (rugosa rose bushes), comprising about 630 hinshu (varieties). Roses can be viewed from mid-June to mid-July and from mid-September to mid-October, but of course, the season depends on the climate and weather for that year. The beautifully planted garden is carefully teiresareta (maintained) with the help of volunteers. I advise you to plan for more time that you would expect. Because the grounds are quite vast, you will need some time to explore them and discover what is in bloom. You might want to start by visiting the indoor garden and general information center, Shikisaikan. (SHS and older: ¥150; JHS: ¥50; Visitors with a Hokkaido Greenland ticket stub: free) Then, walk the rasen (spiral) path of the main rose garden with "hybrid tea roses". These have long, elegant, pointed tsubomi (buds) in many colors. There are also "grandiflora roses" that bloom continuously. Sit on a bench to enjoy the charming view of "climbing roses" planted in stands and arches. Next, visit the Old Rose Path garden which has varieties of roses that existed before 1867! Each of these fragrant "old roses" is carefully labeled. I was fortunate enough to visit with a friend who has grown old roses and has a hyakkajiten-tekina (encyclopedic) knowledge of them. She was delighted to meet a few varieties she had never seen before! Before leaving the park, be sure to stop by Le Ciel Rose Shop in the rest house. You can find all sorts of souvenirs with a rose theme: bara-moyou (rose-patterned) teacups and bags, bara-no-kaori (rose-scented) soaps and oils, and more. By now, you will have a good appetite. I recommend a leisurely and delicious Italian lunch at Pizzeria Lucci, sitting in the outside seating if you are so inclined. (Rose garden hours: 9:00–17:00; May be extended depending on the season. Admission: Free)
